Gypsy Horses were developed hundreds of years ago by cross-breeding the Clydesdale, the Shire, the Fells Pony and the Dales Pony with their origins in the UK and Ireland. These horses are known for an abundance of hair and "feather" (hair that flows down on their legs and over the hooves) and very long manes and tails. The first registered horses were imported to the US in 1996. They are known for their sweet and loving nature. More than 60 of America's Gypsy Horse Champions reside at AUNIQUE RANCH. It was our pleasure to be able to watch these beautiful creatures in a natural setting where we were totally surprised and delighted when the mares and fillies were turned out in the pasture with us. We were able to get out of the wagons and experience them really "up close and personal". We were surrounded by soft muzzles nibbling at our clothes and investigating what we were doing. They are amazing. Jeanne told us about the history and parentage of many of them. We found out that their treat of choice is peppermint. We were all digging around in our pockets and purses to see if we had more special Treats for these gentle giants. They may have even been given a breath mint or two... Just sayin'.

We had 2 special guests that accompanied us on our Ranch Tour. Popper, the miniature goat, and Ranger the Ranch dog. Popper was the star of the show and was raised by Jeanne's son, Ryan. Popper truly believes he is one of the children. He made himself at home sitting in the chairs on the wagons and visiting with all of us. We also met "The Girls". Four Turkey Hens raised on the Ranch. Ranger's job is to board whatever Jeanne is driving and take care of her. We visited the Stallion paddocks and the pens where the mares in foal are kept until their due date.

The group we saw are all due in February. We enjoyed our special time with these amazing animals but it was time to head back to the main barn to go into Huntsville for Lunch at the City Hall Café. After a wonderful lunch everyone had the rest of the day free. Dessert and games were scheduled back at the Club House later.
