# "Out of This World" Travel on the 190 Orbit

GNR begins the "Out of This World" summer fun for the RV Travelers. Dock your vehicles in Iowa with friends for fun, seminars, repairs, friendship, and begin an orbit of summer exploration. After GNR you could plan a personal "Out of This World "space traveling trip by jetting up I 35 to I 90. This orbit could send you east or west on an extended "Out of This World" exploration trip?

Your westward orbit could take you pass the Corn Palace in Mitchell, SD for a quick stop. The murals everywhere on the palace are beautiful works of art made from all natural materials. Then onto the Badlands, Mount Rushmore, and the Black Hills of South Dakota for vista's and wildlife. Once back on the orbital push to the west coast, Yellowstone could be the next docking station to rejuvenate the inner spirit. One of the easiest entrances for Yellowstone, according to a travel website, is entering from the north off of I 90 at Bozeman on Hwy 191. West Yellowstone has multiple RV parks for docking and refueling. However, there are several directions to approach Yellowstone and its four entrances. On the orbit from east you could ascend the Beartooth Hwy, but you may want to unhook the tow and drive it up separately. Also, I want to share some blog facts about the west to east exit on the same hwy. The steep grade could cause a dangerous strain on the braking system.

Once back on the I 90 orbit to Missoula, Montana, you could jet your vehicle towards Glacier National Park for rafting, fishing, hiking historic lodges, with space in your galaxy for more blue skies and star filled nights. Leaving I 90 your exploration will climb up Hwy 93 to Hwy 2 your next docking station in West Glacier, Montana. After your wonderful visit in Glacier National park, return to I 90 for a continued easy western orbit into Washington for wineries, fishing, good fresh fish dinners, sightseeing, more mountains and cool weather out of the Texas heat.

"Out of This World" travel, with beautiful blue skies closer to the heavens, is just a turn west on the I 90 orbit, a little north of GNR. Plan your trip and extend your summer out of the Texas heat. This is not a Winnebago Tour or sanctioned trip, just a personal trip last summer that is being expanded this year because of a love of the mountains.
